Band Member of Note

Max Heckard was born and grew up in Molalla, Oregon, where from fourth to twelfth grade he played trumpet in concert band, summer marching band, pep band, and dance band. Max holds a Bachelor's in Math from Brown University and a Masters in Theoretical Math from University of Kentucky.



After sinus surgeries and allergy shots in 2010, Max picked up a C trumpet but did not start playing until 2017, a year after he and his wife Josie Lazarus moved to Santa Fe. Their house-keeper asked if he would help her kids with music, so he got a trumpet and joined the SFCB in May. There were already nine trumpeters, so he moved to the baritone section. "I find the concert band a great place to be, as I study and practice music unlike any time in high school or college," he adds.

Max taught college mathematics but was recruited into aero-space and communications where he worked for 26 years. Currently he is a gardener, a member of the Santa Fe Scrabble Club, a Sanskrit hobbyist, and a volunteer for the Salvation Army Youth Band.

Max is also an artist, with favorite activities that include fused and cast glass, ceramic sculpture, drawing and painting. In a complex life, he has found good advice in Rilke, Spenser, Shankaracharya and others. Double vision keeps him from reading for leisure.

"Now the study and practice of music is foremost. I would like to practice more with other band members so to further develop ensemble proficiency," Max says. Favorite composers are Bach, Beethoven (i.e., the 8th and the later quartets), Palestrina, Handel, and Schoenberg.

Max and Josie have known each other since 1972, having met at India Imports of Rhode Island in Providence. They now will compare music and yoga practice, such as how a phrase and a pose have similar challenges.

Records Set & Attendance this Year

Only 35 band members in 1985 and now 63 plus 8 seasonal members and 3 students

A total of 15 performances this year and possibly two more

Second highest attendance at a Federal Park concert on Father's Day: 376 compared to 411 Father's Day in 2012

Second lowest attendance at a Federal Park concert at our Mid-Summer concert: 123 in the audience, compared to 117 for the Historic Concert in 2017

The total attendance for the four Federal Park concerts this year was 1008. In the previous 5 years the four-concert

regularly as member of the Kettle Players for a number of years, as well as a member of the band for many concerts.



total was in the range of 514 to 767; only in 2011 did we break 1000 with the four-concert total at 1193. We had a total of 376 in the audience at the Father's Day concert, on a very hot Mid-Summer concert, only 123.

Two additional performances were added this year, and we will have one more on December 22 at Santa Fe Place at 2:00.

I am very happy, as is Treb Clef, with the income from the Ride for the Band which was at \$6433.00 this year above the mean of \$6231.50 for the six years that we have done the Ride for the Band as our annual fundraiser.





Notes from the Director

The Santa Fe Concert Band had a very busy summer, and the feedback from the public and band members was that it was very successful. Elaine Heltman, my talented wife, ably took the reins as guest conductor as I enjoyed some time in California following my retirement as Executive Director of the Santa Fe Symphony. I enjoyed hearing the many kudos for her leadership, musicianship, and enthusiasm.

Now we are preparing for our annual Holiday Performance at the Lensic, scheduled for Monday, December 10th at 7:00. We are working on some old favorites of course such as Leroy Anderson's *A Christmas Festival*, our own Bob Jones' *A Solstice Festival*, and Reisetter's *The Eighth Candle* (a beautiful Hannukah work). For more variety I have also added Moncayo's festive and joyous *Huapango*. We will be adding some new works including a terrific rendition of the Vaughan Williams' *Fantasia on Greensleeves*.

Also this December we will be performing at Santa Fe Place Mall on two occasions, and many

of our players will be out and about (including myself from time to time) accompanying in small mixed ensembles the Bell Ringers with their annual holiday Kettle Drive. This is a small way to give back to The Salvation Army for providing a wonderful space for for our weekly rehearsals for at least two decades We thank the Salvation Army for their support and encouragement.

Our present membership is approaching 63 active members, and our yearly concert schedule is well filled. Our Band members are truly dedicated and energized by being a vital part of our community.

These performances come off without a hitch because of our Band's President Paul Pease. Paul's selfless dedication not only as President but as talented hornist, Band Manager, and Chief Organizer of the annual *Ride for the Band* spring fundraiser has brought the Band to the stature it enjoys today. Building on 153 years of music making in Santa Fe, The Santa Fe Concert Band's future looks bright indeed. Thank you Paul.
