The Band's spring concert is upon us and I am very excited. The members are enthused and have been very dedicated in learning new and some technically challenging music. It has been wonderful to hear and celebrate their accomplishments and growing musicianship week after week at our regular Tuesday night rehearsals

As I recall, our first spring concert was in 1986, also in St. Francis Auditorium. For many years we annually presented a performance in late March or April as way to perform music that is unsuitable in an outdoor setting. We took a several year hiatus from the playing a spring concert but I am glad to say the tradition was restored under the leadership of past President Paul Pease.

This year's program begins with Copland's majestic Fanfare for the Common Man. The concert will also feature Sousa's Manhattan Beach march, a medley from The Pirates of the Caribbean, a terrific concert band tone poem titled Red Rock Mountain, followed by the from the movie Silverado which was filmed in the Santa Fe area in 1985 and nominated for an Oscar for the music). Other well-known marches, The Transit of Venus, Valdres (considered the national march of Norway), and Zacatecas round out the program.

I want to again recognize the dedication of our Band members who have worked hard to bring this music to the stage. Please join us at St. Francis auditorium on April 7 at 2:00pm for this wonderful concert. Admission is free. Donations are welcomed, accepted and very much appreciated.

Where are you from?
I grew up in Seaford, New York, on Long Island. I still go to NY once or twice a year to visit my family — and the ocean.

What are you doing now and what's instore for the future?
