The Bugle Is Going Green (at least still trying)



The ACB 2022 Convention, Santa Fe, New Mexico Brought to you by the NM ACB Consortium



Santa Fe Concert Band has teamed with Albuquerque Concert Band and Los Alamos Community Winds to form the New Mexico Association of Concert Bands Consortium (NMACBC). The Consortium was originally formed to host the Association of Concert Bands (ACB) 2021 Annual Convention. As you might expect, the Convention was postponed until 2022.

WHAT IS IT?

The convention is a 4-day conference for band directors, members and managers, as well as music history leaders, administrators, and board members, meet to exchange personal views and share experiences. The week includes educational seminars and clinics and performances by selected community bands. Attendees may participate in the Convention Band led by well-known conductors. The conference offers opportunity for networking among professional and fellow community band musicians.

In order to present the Convention, many volunteers have been meeting regularly to organize the NMACB Consortium, plan the event and begin raising money required to host the event. I believe the Mission Statement of the NMACBC represents how all of us, from audience to performers to supporting friends and family, recognize the importance of community-based music.

Mission of the NMACBC

The New Mexico Association of Concert Bands Consortium (NMACBC) is made up of the Albuquerque Concert Band, the Los Alamos Community Winds, and the Santa Fe Concert Band. The mission of the NMACBC is to host the national convention of the Association of Concert Bands (ACB) in Santa Fe, NM, in Spring 2022. The "Music for Life" Convention in The City Different will celebrate largely volunteer North American community-based wind bands. A cherished tradition that predates the founding of the United States, these bands have played crucial roles in bridging differences, instilling community spirit, educating students, and bringing together all ages of Americans. Clinics and concerts will foster excellence in concert band music for participants of all ages and a variety of skill levels with nationally renowned instructors. Free public concerts will be performed by guest bands invited to play.

Although it feels like a long way off, there are many reasons to get excited, today, about the 2022 Convention. Musicians from throughout the region and all of North America will plan to attend to celebrate volunteer-based music and how important it is in our lives. Guest bands will be selected to perform in a series of concerts throughout the week, culminating in the 2022 Music for Life Convention Band, made up of members from around the country.

Between now and 2022, there will be many exciting developments in the Convention activities. Here are the initial, confirmed highlights:

- The Convention Band Conductor will be Captain Christina A. Muncey, Flight Commander for the United States Air Force Band.
- Jazz Trombonist Harry Watters will perform with local and Convention Bands, as well as provide a Clinic to Convention Participants.
- Dr. Eric Lau, Saxophone, will be a Guest Performer and Clinician, professor at UNM.
- Dr. Jennifer Lau, Flute, will be a Guest Performer and Clinician, professor at UNM.
- The highly acclaimed Canadian Brass will provide a clinic for Convention attendees, as well as a performance open to the public here in Santa Fe.

In order to make this Convention come to fruition, we need help. Santa Fe Concert Band has committed to hosting the convention as part of the NMACBC, and this includes fundraising. The fundraising budget for the event is \$60,000, which is half of the total budget (the balance being paid by convention registrants).
